Angharad Dean : Artist in Residence University of Tübingen, Germany

Angharad Dean is an Australian artist. She studied design of the built environment (these days called urban design) and after completing a post graduate degree in urban and regional planning worked as a town planner for 22 years before becoming a full time artist in 2005. She has studied under numerous tutors in multiple art disciplines.

In 2021 she was appointed **Artist in Residence** at the University of Tübingen in Germany. There she teaches art at the Ziecheninstitut in the Interdisciplinary Program as well as in the Austrian Alps as part of the Global Awareness Program and works on her own practice as an artist from her studio in a former fossil washing laboratory below the Palaeontology Museum of the University.

She is also a volunteer land carer when resident in Canberra, Australia

ARTIST'S STATEMENT

It is important to me for my work to imply movement and connection: that the world is not a static place, that everywhere things move, perhaps only visible over the vastness of geological time, and that nothing happens in isolation, we are all part of one world. This idea that the world is always changing gives me hope that the heavy weight of mankind on the earth can evolve towards a light touch and that, by opening a window to the beauty of the world, my art moves people to care more for this earth and all the life upon it.

It remains a personal narrative though: the relationship between me and the things that surround me. They speak to me and I listen and translate what I hear through my eyes into images. I work with my whole body as it is with my whole body that I see, feel, absorb earth, trees, water, sky. It's like poetry in motion, the poetry of colour.

Sometimes I get an idea and it takes me somewhere that surprises and delights me. This is the power of liquid medium – they flow and blend in ways that you can not perfectly predict until it is happening – many times the work takes me along with it until the end result is entirely its own creation. These are the works that satisfy me the most because they are fresh, a unique response to the day, place, even the moisture in the air, the music I have been listening to, or the sound of birds. Similarly, when I am printing or sewing on the machine, whilst initially there is a plan, the surprise of the final outcome as you reveal the result is what delights and excites me.

I am constantly learning, refreshing, expanding and challenging myself in my work, but perhaps towards the end of my endeavours I will have made a body of work to be proud of – one where an outside viewer can see the development, perhaps feel the thought processes that led to the evolution of techniques and images. And I hope that through looking at my work they will be able to feel the joy of life, the sorrow of loss and find strength through seeing beauty in the world.

KEY EXPERIENCE:

In mid 2005 Angharad Dean left an award winning career as a planner to take up the apparently inevitable call of her genes. She turned from working with people and landscape (taking a 4 dimensional view of the world) to capturing the immediacy of light, colour and movement in 2 dimensions: now she attempts to capture the 4th dimension – time - in the medium of the 2nd. Her initial training as a designer has enabled her to see the world through an artist's eyes.

Angharad Dean worked as an urban and regional planner experienced in strategic planning, statutory planning, community consultation, environmental and economic impact assessment, and social planning full time from 1981 until 2005. She managed a wide variety of projects covering physical, environmental, social, economic and statutory inputs in the ACT, and Queensland as well as in NSW and the Northern Territory. She was the chief architect of the Canberra Spatial Plan (the first new strategic plan for Canberra post self government) and

designed and managed the process that delivered this plan. Her final major work in planning was the implementation of the Canberra Spatial Plan and the Sustainable Transport Plan for the ACT in 2004-2005.

Key responsibilities during this period included managing the development and implementation of major government policy documents:

The project has now moved into implementation phase, with a detailed implementation plan prepared with associated milestones and outcomes to deliver the 150 actions identified in the Spatial Plan. A core team of 5 people are working on this implementation, with a budget for the next financial year of \$1 million.

The Sustainable Transport Plan for the ACT – management of the implementation phase of the Transport Plan for Canberra, including over the next 2 years managing \$6 million in key projects. The Transport Team comprises 7 people.

The Canberra Plan – key input into the development of The Canberra Plan and its other component parts (the *Economic White Paper* and the *Canberra Social Plan*).

Indonesia's Environment and Population Sectors: Australian Development Cooperation Activities

Australian International Development Assistance Bureau

The paper, now published by AIDAB, includes an overview of environmental management and environmental issues in Indonesia, and a summary of environmentally targeted projects, projects with a substantial environment focus and other activities with an environment component.

Review and environmental audit of all current AIDAB projects with an identifiable environmental impact or which were environmentally targeted, to determine the environmental impact of Australia's development cooperation programs. The objectives of the review were to: investigate the actual and likely environmental impact of environmentally significant projects, environmentally targeted projects and AIDAB's multilateral activities; and to formulate conclusions on the basis of individual project analysis.

Effectiveness Review of Multilateral Development Banks

Preparation of extensive and detailed research papers covering many aspects of the Multilateral Development Banks (World Bank, Asian Development Bank, International Fund for Agricultural Development) for an independent review team. Issues investigated included the Banks' attention to and policies, guidelines and implementation mechanisms relating to the environment, participatory development, policy dialogue, aid coordination and women in development.

Environmental Markers

Analysis of all AIDAB activities and development programs to determine which environmental impact category activities fall into and what consideration has been given to environmental issues in project design and implementation. These environmental markers are an important element in AIDAB's assessment of its performance in relation to environmental issues. The project involved detailed consultation with every country desk officer in AIDAB and discussion of over 600 current activities. A booklet defining the markers and their purpose was developed as a result of this consultancy, based on the completion report prepared by Angharad.

Rocky Hill Local Environmental Study*Wagga Wagga City Council, NSW*

Team leader for preparation of a draft Local Environmental Study for a large hill top site on the edge of Wagga Wagga urban area. In 1992, a second social survey and an assessment of the impact of the forest industry on local government finances in Oberon were key components of the study. Angharad was team member for the social and local government impacts components of the study.

Economic Development and Marketing Strategy for Jindabyne*NSW Department of Planning, NSW Tourism Commission*

Preparation of an Economic Development and Marketing Strategy for the town of Jindabyne, including the preparation of an opportunity profile which assessed development opportunities and constraints (including the major constraint relating to water quality problems in Lake Jindabyne), and the preparation of a Marketing Prospectus for the town to encourage investors and residents to locate in the town. Angharad was a team member for the study and was extensively involved in consultations with the local business community, local residents and government agencies (including the Snowy River Shire Council), she drafted the Opportunity Profile and had significant input into the Economic Development Strategy for the town.

Duffy/Holder Investigation Area Study*ACT Planning Authority*

This study analysed the development potential of a large area of land to the north of the suburbs of Duffy and Holder which is an 'investigation area' in the Draft Territory Plan. The report explored the feasibility of using part (or all) of the site for some form of urban development, within the environmental constraints of the site. Constraints, opportunities and potential development areas were identified. Extensive consultation with government and non government agencies was a key component of the project.

Fyshwick and Environs Planning Study*ACT Planning Authority*

Preparation of lease and development conditions for new release sites and identification of options for extension of Fyshwick Industrial Area as a member of a planning team. Angharad was also responsible for reviewing and summarising the historical and current planning policies (NCDC, ACTPA and NCPA) affecting the whole of Fyshwick and surrounding areas.

Tharwa Bridge Options Study*Urban Services Department, ACT*

Preparation of an analysis of social, economic and environmental impacts of options for bridge access to Tharwa. The project included the conduct of a questionnaire survey of residents and a public consultation

Preparation of Ipswich Town Planning Scheme

- team member preparing the Zoning Scheme, including responsibility for the detailed preparation of performance criteria and objectives for development (an innovative planning approach);

Preparation of the document involved detailed research of the many topics relevant to the Plan and liaison with many government agencies.

Preparation of Development Control Plans

Preparation of a draft development control plan for the historic areas of Ipswich, located adjacent to the city centre and facing pressures for commercial and high density residential redevelopment. The development control plan emphasised the importance of integration and continued use of buildings rather than preservation

per se. The overall theme of the plan was the conservation and enhancement of visual precincts allowing a mixed use of buildings in order to encourage their preservation. Angharad prepared both the draft plan and the background report in support of the plan.

Input into a draft Development Control Plan for the central city in Ipswich, to both control and enhance development opportunities whilst conserving historic streetscapes.

Preparation of Policy Documents

Preparation of draft Council policies and the background reports to support the policies covering the following topics:

- the acquisition of flood liable land for park and recreation purposes;
- the acquisition, maintenance and upgrading of parkland throughout the city for passive recreation purposes;
- the requirement for Environmental Impact Statements for developments;

Assessment of Development Proposals and Preparation of Planning Reports for Council

The assessment of development proposals required a working knowledge of planning and environmental legislation in Queensland, and elsewhere and an up to date knowledge of a wide range of issues, including the environment, social planning and economic pressures for development. Planning reports were required to be precise, yet cover all the relevant issues, in order to give Council Alderman a good basis for decision making. The reports were also necessary for Council's submissions to the state government on rezoning matters.

Marine Park Zoning Plan for Pumicestone Passage, Queensland:

draft zoning plan for the Pumicestone Passage Marine Park (including a review of all current legislation controlling the use of waterways, and controlling the use of land adjoining the waterways affecting or impacting on the environmental quality of the waterways)

Strategic Plan for Darwin CBD, Northern Territory
